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informed that Senator Kremer is on his way. And did you say you'd be willing to proceed? And did you want a machine vote, Senator Chambers? Okay. The question before us then is the adoption of FA1185. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 41 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. Members, I'm going to leave us under call here. There are no further lights at this point. Members, at this time the question would be the adoption of the committee amendment. And I would recognize Senator Vrtiska to close on the committee amendment, if he would like. Senator Vrtiska waives closing. Then the...Senator Chambers, did you wish to speak on the adoption of the committee amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Why...?

SPEAKER BROMM: We've adopted your amendment, and now the question would be the adoption of the committee amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I just want to make one comment on that, if I may.

SPEAKER BROMM: You may.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I didn't know we were going to go right to a waiver. The only thing I want to do is explain clearly what the committee amendment does. It strikes all reference in the green copy of the bill to employees, to a specific amount of money, to the settlement of grievances, and such things as that. The only thing that will be left in the bill is language to the effect that the university will pay the stipend. The amount is to be determined by the university. And the bill will not take effect until at least four other legislatures with teams in the Big 12 will pass similar legislation. That is what the bill now will do, with the adoption of the committee amendment. And I strongly urge you to adopt it. And since I'm not going to speak again on the
