university's image. They're bringing in revenue. They cannot gain anything in the way of spendable income anywhere, being practical. Because even with Senator Beutler's amendment, you have a set of circumstances where, with the nature of the work that the players do in conjunction with football, the fact that they have to attend classes, then they must find some study time, it would be extremely difficult for them to work. But because the bill is serving a symbolic purpose, its terms, in my view, will never be invoked or made operational, this statement that Senator Beutler wants to make is acceptable from my point of view. SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you again, Mr. Speaker. I see that Senator Beutler is now available. Senator Beutler, again, I want to commend you for your amendment. And I've asked that the Clerk file an amendment to your amendment, and I'm wondering how you'll react to it. What I'd like to do is express the sense of the Legislature that your approach, your alternative, is really the preferable alternative. So I'm asking to craft some language, providing that your alternative is the preferable alternative, and I wonder how you would feel about that, if you would yield.
