SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the closing on AM0743 to LB 688. The question before the body is adoption of that amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of the Beutler amendment, AM0743, to LB 688. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Beutler's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Beutler amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next item to the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Chambers would move to amend, FALL92. (Legislative Journal page 787.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers to open.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment is on your gadget. Before I tell you what it says...and you can call it up on your gadget in the meantime...this bill actually does not cost a penny. When the Governor signs it, if it gets to his desk, and I'm hoping and expecting that it will, nothing will change from the way things are now. The bill will not take effect with reference to any of its provisions until at least four other legislatures in the Big 12 would enact this kind of legislation. But with the discussion going on, other legislators in other states that are not connected with the Big 12 are looking at what the NCAA is doing in dictating to its universities. The purpose of this bill is to get the message to the NCAA, and it will be a powerful message, that not only are legislators looking at it, but a Governor is willing to go on record, pointing out that something has to be done to improve the way athletes are treated. The fact that we have to move in this way acknowledges something which I'm shocked that people in the body, like Senator Raikes, as Chairman of the Education Committee, Senator
