funds of the university might then have to be used to underwrite some of the costs of these sports programs that do not generate funds on their own?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, because I think the record that we've made makes it clear that we're talking about money generated by the football team. And I'll tell you why I'm not writing in every one of those provisions. The bill would become as complex as the NCAA rules. I think it's clear that the university has the discretion. And if the money is not there, they don't pay the stipend. And Senator Brashear, I think, may be preparing something that will further address the issue that you're raising.

SENATOR REDFIELD: And certainly we could in the future address that. If in fact other states approve this and we were to move in that direction, we could come back and address that at that time?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Correct.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Redfield. Senator Friend.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, see, all Senator Chambers has to do is invoke my name, and then suddenly might light just goes on. I don't know...I've heard you have that skill. I'm not going to get off...I'm still concerned about the federal aspect of what we're dealing with here, and I'll tell you why, Senator Chambers, and then I had a question for you. The revenue...there's a reason that Major League Baseball, the National Football League, the National Hockey League, that they are driving...that these cities and these corporations are driving for revenue sharing types of packages. I think the NFL actually already has one. Major League Baseball has been driving one for a long time, but I think the baseball union, which is a powerful union, has blocked some of those efforts. Either you agree with those or you don't agree with them. I don't know how I feel about those. The point is, they're looking for revenue sharing because each
