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this...where Senator Chambers is moving this. And if he would yield, I'd like to ask him a series of questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, will you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Senator Chambers, I earlier said that the...my impression was that this was more about principle than law, per se. Was that a fair statement?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: It's accurate. Yes, it is a fair statement.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: The record which you have been able to compile in terms of this debate is important to the you and to the effort which you are leading. Is that true?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's true.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: The...what we call the intent language of the bill, and what I call the premises of the bill, are as important as any other aspect of the bill. Are they not?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is true.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: You, in fact, are not trying to lead the charge all the way as the front person in this effort, are you?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: We are engaged in making findings of fact for and on behalf of the people of the state of Nebraska, such that their university, which interacts with the regulatory authorities, will be empowered and emboldened to address the circumstances which you describe in the intent language. Is that correct?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Amen. That is correct.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Now, Senator Chambers, to further illustrate
