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do get an education while they're here. There's lots of places where that does not happen. Senator Chambers,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...any questions?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, I will.

SENATOR JOHNSON: I'll give you the opportunity to ask some of the questions you were asking this morning.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I don't need to ask them now, Senator Johnson, because much was done to the bill in your absence.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay. Well, ...and, very frankly, I think that there is much that has been done, as Senator Chambers is alluding to, that it does do what I wanted, and that's this. As I'm an old Navy guy, I believe in firing one across the bow first. And I think that's what this legislation does.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: What I was concerned about before is that we were firing for effect on the first shot. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I was...I'm on the Business and Labor Committee. We heard the bill. If you look at the committee statement, with original Chambers amendment, we voted the bill out of committee seven to zip. And I think Senator Chambers, in his opening on the bill and discussion on the bill, is that...and I supported with the football player. I think we made the bill better when we expanded to include all the athletics, people who participate in athletics at the Big 12 schools. But football today at the collegiate level is a full-time job. Not only...they're busy
