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comments by Senator Beutler; is, yes, the livestock industry should possibly be taking care of and making sure that we are having safe water, clean water, clean air, but I think it's...the livestock industry is already taking care of that. This...these mandates are really coming down from the public. The public, the organized groups, individuals, concerned citizens for Nebraska, they are demanding that we do all this. We are doing this and because of this is the reason that we have all these permitting fees, inspection fees. The people out there in the community are doing the right thing and I am very much concerned with this being tacked on to this bill, and I rise in opposition to this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator. Chair would like to recognize the Speaker for an announcement.

SPEAKER BROMM: And thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor. I'd like to give the body a heads up on a small agenda change. There has been a motion filed to suspend the rules and cancel a hearing, which is scheduled for next week on a bill, LB 805, and the motion I think is by Senator Schimek, and we'll take that up shortly before we adjourn, between 11:30 and 12:00, just to give you an idea. Thank you.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Transportation will have an Executive Session underneath the north balcony at ten o'clock; Transportation, ten o'clock, north balcony.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Chair would recognize Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor and members of the body. I, too, would like to speak in opposition and would maybe echo some of the things that Senator Stuthman said and also Senator Schrock. I'm concerned with the profitability that's out there right now in the livestock industry, as well as agriculture, and we're talking about what Senator...former Senator...(laugh) name slips me right now, always talked about we're the food producers, not just necessarily cattle producers.
