the, you know, kind of the fund of the Attorney General...or I mean the county attorney. How is this going to work now in this bill versus what we had in the previous bill? Senator Bromm, if you'd answer that.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Hartnett, the answer is yes and no.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Oh. (Laugh)

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes, the answer is, yes, the Attorney General's Office will handle the prosecutions if this bill is passed; and, no, there will be no involvement of the Lincoln County Attorney or other county attorneys' offices in handling these prosecutions. So the money for the prosecution will come through the Attorney General's Office, although at this time it won't be a General Fund budget matter, but it will be as a result of money that's available if we comply with all of our federal requirements through the Nebraska Highway Safety Administration.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Will the Attorney General's Office then go out to Lincoln County? I think that's North Platte, is it?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes, unless the particular matter is handled telephonically or by videoconferencing or something. Otherwise, they would go out there.

SENATOR HARTNETT: So everything will be handled by the Attorney General.

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes, it would.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER BROMM: And...

SENATOR HARTNETT: You want...

SPEAKER BROMM: ...and I just think, you know, as importantly, if not more so, than the disparity in claims that are submitted and some of the claims which appear to be questionable, that
