dispensing to Nebraska residents. Cancer drugs may be donated by any person or entity via physician's office, pharmacy, hospital, health clinic that elects to participate in the program and meets the eligibility standards established by the department. The amendment retains critical (sic) for acceptance of donated cancer drugs under the program from the bill as introduced. The amendment requires compliance by participating physician offices, pharmacies, hospitals, health clinics, with all available...or applicable state and federal law relating to storage, distribution, and dispensing of the drugs. The amendment permits donated cancer drugs to be distributed to another participating physician's office, pharmacy, hospital, or health clinic for dispensing. The amendment revises the immunity provisions. It provides immunity from civil and criminal liability or professional disciplinary action for any person or entity that acts with reasonable care in donating, accepting, distributing, or dispensing cancer drugs under the program. The donation of a cancer drug by a cancer drug manufacturer does not absolve the manufacturer of any criminal or civil liability that would have existed but for the donation, including, but not limited to, liability for failure to transfer or communicate product or consumer information or the expiration date of the donated cancer drug. The liability provisions of the committee amendments are revised from language suggested by the Nebraska Association of Trial Attorneys. It establishes a negligence standard for liability under the Cancer Drug Repository Program. And I want to draw your attention to a particular...or, to this issue. The amendment deletes any eligibility which means...which is a means testing requirement for persons who receive donated cancer drugs under the program. With that, that eliminated any fiscal note on the bill. The committee amendment leaves the decision as to who receives the donated cancer drugs to the prescribing practitioner. As...that concludes my remarks, with the exception that, as Senator McDonald did mention, we are still receiving some information on the liability section. And I think that we can address those concerns. Certainly my committee, Senator McDonald, are willing to work with that and between now and Select File sit down and...to make any corrections on this section to ensure that this becomes operatory. This was advanced from the committee unanimously. And I would just ask for support for the committee
