SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments to LB 756. As stated, there is an amendment, offered by Senator McDonald, to that amendment. Senator McDonald to open on AM0769. (Legislative Journal page 843.)

SENATOR McDONALD: Mr. President and members, AM0756 (sic--AM0769) is a technical amendment from the Health and Human Services. It contains three changes. On page 1, line 8 and 9, we're inserting additional language to clarify what type of drugs the program covers. There are a number of prescription drugs that are not used to treat the cancer itself. This language broadens the definition to include all cancer-related prescriptions. On page 1, lines 18 and 19, we're expanding the definition of "physician office" to mirror the terms as they appear in the uniform licensing laws. On page 4, line 4, we're substituting "upon the recommendation" for "with the approval." The new language is consistent with the existing statute dealing with dispensing. Again, these changes are from the Health and Human Services, and simply make the language consistent with existing statutes. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator McDonald. You've heard the opening on AM0769, which is an amendment to the committee amendments to LB 756. Open for discussion on that amendment. Senator Connealy.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I rise in support of the amendment and the underlying bill. I want to thank Senator McDonald for bringing this. Cancer touches so many of our families. I lost my father to cancer in '91, and a sister last year. And in both those cases, we did have many prescriptions left over. And I think that this is a logical thing to do. I think that it's a progressive thing to do. And I want to thank Senator McDonald for bringing this.
