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places to visit, if you'd like to come. I've mentioned them before on the floor of the Legislature, and some of them are public facilities and some of them are businesses. Cabela's is one prime facility, the number-two visited landmark...or location in the state of Nebraska. Fantastic place to come and see what's there and see the opportunities. Chimney Rock; Lake McConaughy, which has 12 miles of water. Lake McConaughy still has 12 miles of water. Can you believe that? We have plenty of water. Come out and visit us. But the concerns that I do hear is, well, there are other options out there for individuals. And when we talk about bidding for these conventions, which is a big part of tourism to a lot of people, is bringing in groups, bringing in outside organizations to our state, if they look at that and say, I can go to Ogallala, and they now have the tax of this, plus other taxes, and could potentially get over 10, 12, 14 percent, or they could go across the state line, and depending upon what Wyoming or Colorado might have, they could stay there at a reduced cost to the actual overall facility. So I have some concerns about the end result of this. I don't doubt that there is a need for tourism in the state one bit, absolutely not, but I do have concerns about the end result of this, because I think this is another tax placed on individuals. And I think the other argument is this: this is optional. I think it's the same argument that we have with lids. Property tax lids, other lids, that's a limit, right? Well, name me very many school districts in the state that aren't trying to hit that limit, because there's other things tied with that. And I think that's the same thing here. If given the option, they're going to do it. If they can prove that they can do it and provide a benefit, they're going to do it. So it's not a matter of whether it's optional or not. I think if you do this, I think overwhelmingly the counties beat down the door and do this. I think there is some inadequacies, though, between allowing Omaha to have this singularly, and other counties. So, I'm still listening. I appreciate the discussion. I thought Senator Smith had some interesting ideas that I wish would have debated a little bit further. But I will continue to listen. Thank you.
