SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing on the confirmation report offered by the Agriculture Committee. The question before the body is adoption of that report. All in favor of the question vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the confirmation report offered by the Agriculture Committee. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote, Legislative Journal page 911.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the confirmation report as offered by the Agriculture Committee.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The confirmation report is adopted. We move on to General File, 2002 committee priority bills. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, an announcement. The Retirement Committee will meet at 10:00 underneath the north balcony; Retirement at 10:00, north balcony.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 209, a bill by Senator Bromm. (Read title.) Bill was introduced on January 10 of this year, referred to the Transportation Committee at that time for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. Bill was discussed briefly, Mr. President, on Thursday, March 13.
