SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Members of the Legislature, I've been listening to this argument and I know that we do have a problem with especially in alcohol-related instances. I was looking at Section 4 and, Senator Bromm, if you could...if you could answer a couple of questions for me.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you yield?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: In Section 4, now I'm presuming that this is after the fact, that the person has been arrested. On page 5 of the green copy, line 17, says if the person has an operator's license, the arresting peace officer shall take possession of that license and issue a temporary operator's license valid for 30 days. Now is this after they've had the hearing?

SPEAKER BROMM: No, this is before the hearing.

SENATOR JANSSEN: This is before the hearing.

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Does he issue that temporary license immediately upon taking the revocation of the license?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So...

SPEAKER BROMM: Or upon release from jail, if they've been incarcerated overnight or (inaudible).

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. So if the person in the...who was driving a vehicle is stopped and they give a breathalyzer test and he's .9 or whatever it is now, just a little over that, does he issue that temporary license immediately after taking his original license?
