SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. And only in cases where the person was really intoxicated, would they still issue that temporary license?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yeah, I think they're entitled to that until they have the revocation hearing.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. And what's the length of time during that, usually, during that period of time from the arrest till...is it within 30 days?

SPEAKER BROMM: It's within 30 days.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. All right. Thank you, Senator Bromm. I wasn't sure there. Now does this happen in all cases? Say if there was a fatality or several fatalities, do they still issue that temporary license?

SPEAKER BROMM: I'll double-check, but I'm pretty confident they do.

SENATOR JANSSEN: So actually, the person could drive on home after he was arrested?

SPEAKER BROMM: Well, no. If they had reason to believe he had been drinking, they wouldn't let him drive home. They...

SENATOR JANSSEN: But they would still issue the temporary license.

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Bromm. And I'll give the rest of my time to Senator Bromm, Senator Cudaback.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank...
