SPEAKER BROMM: Well, Senator Chambers, what I would be willing to do is to go ahead and accept your amendment if you pull the rest of your amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SPEAKER BROMM: And I understand that there is particularly another section of the bill that you have concerns about that we would discuss between now and Select File, but that you would bring that up on Select File. And we're making no representations at all. We're miles apart on that section I know, so we may have to just battle that out. But on this one, I'm willing to go ahead and accept your amendment on this section of the bill, but we would like to move the bill and continue to work off the floor on the rest of it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And so that everybody understands, when I pull those other pending amendments, it is not that I will not bring them up on Select and discuss them, but I will pull them at this point so that with the adoption of the amendment that's pending now, the bill will not be hindered by me, at this point, and you will work through whoever else may have an amendment pending now. That's where we are, is that correct?

SPEAKER BROMM: That's correct, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, I'm asking that my amendment be adopted, and then, and while I'm on my feet, I will...well, maybe it's premature. We will take it a step at a time. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. There are two lights on that. Senator Beutler, followed by Senator Connealy.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature, this is completely unrelated to this debate, but I had passed out something to you, as we get closer to the budget debate, I intend to try to point out little things now and then that don't take too much of your time but might have an effect on how you feel about how we meet our budget deficit.
