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base wage. It's not overtime. It's not bonuses. States around us, with the exception of Wyoming, have some kind of minimums, some are higher, some are lower. This places us slightly higher than most and below our most notorious competitor, which is Iowa. So the second thing is a minimum wage. A third thing that the bill does is that it adds some disclosure language, and this is the committee amendments now. The disclosure language does two things. Number one, it tries to get us the number of human beings that are getting LB 775 benefits as part of being part of a project. We now collect two pieces of information and neither one tells us the number of human beings that are benefitting by LB 775. One of them is FTE collections. Unfortunately, a full-time equivalent is 40 hours of labor, whether or not there is a human...there is one individual getting that or not. You see, with LB 775, if Chip Maxwell and I are working 40 hours and all of a sudden we get both 20 new hours of overtime, his 20 hours and my 20 hours collectively is 40 hours, and the two of us now wind up being three people as far as LB 775 is concerned. You don't have to have a human being with that 40 hours...for that 40 hours. If you break up your overtime, you can have 10 or 15 employees sharing that overtime, and it becomes 30 employees for the purposes of our accounting. So that, although it's a valuable piece of information, doesn't tell us how many people are getting real benefits. The second thing we have is how many employees were there before you began the project and how many did you have at the end of the project. But the problem there is you can have employees away from the project that are let go and this will be part of that accounting system. So you can't find the number of people that are benefitting by being part of a LB 775 project. You can find FTEs but not people. So one of the things we asked for is, tell us the number of people that are getting jobs. The second thing we say is this, take our historical amount of information that we have over in the Revenue Department and free up our Fiscal Office to send over somebody to take our TRAIN project over there and run that data against our TRAIN project. In fact, I will have an amendment to get that even clearer. The Fiscal Office normally has to give us all individual information and, in fact, this says they can't give us this information individually. They can't share with us anything they learn about taxes by individual companies with any of us. The only
