SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. Time, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Sorry. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator McDonald, followed by Senator Thompson and five others.

SENATOR McDONALD: I'd like to take...give my time back to Pam Brown.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brown, you have almost five minutes.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you. And I will yield back to Senator McDonald when I'm done. But we're actually going to talk a little bit, maybe, together about this. Because there is a company that is located in Omaha in my legislative district...actually, one of the partners in it, the brothers that are partners, is a constituent of mine. And it is a company that I spent some time with talking about their incentives that they received under LB 775. And they are a company that does telemarketing and telecommunications. And they had an opportunity to expand. And they looked at expanding their existing facilities in Omaha, and then looked at Ord, Nebraska, which is in Senator McDonald's district, and decided to expand in Ord. Now, they provided me with some information verbally about some of the decision points that they had to make in making this expansion. And it was clear to me, absent the economic development incentives, it did not make financial sense for them to make...to do this expansion. And that's something that we have to remember, that if businesses aren't going to make money, they're not going to do expansions. But I would yield now to Senator McDonald to talk about what the impact has been in Ord, Nebraska, by this company. I would yield my time back to Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: (Microphone malfunction)...one of the largest employers in Ord, Nebraska. And it really did fit a niche there. Most of the employees are women, wives of farmers. And you know, I think I talked about the other day about walking up and down the streets and carrying a sign, working for benefits.
