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SENATOR HARTNETT: I think we have one company, Senator Jones, that has been...as I looked at the charts and so forth, I...and I was kind of surprised, because that that was...there is one company that has gotten LB 775.

SENATOR JONES: Was that recent? Would that been Advantage Receivable?

SENATOR HARTNETT: About '95, I think was the...

SENATOR JONES: No, this would have to been a lot...since then, because they was in Ainsworth, I think, in about '97, 8, 9, along in there.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. There could be...yeah, there could be more than that. I just glanced at the book the other day. And I think that was a telemarketing. I think they pulled out of...you know, they pulled out of a rural area, because they didn't have...I don't know what...the change of philosophy of the management. They wanted to have a bigger pool. So there might be more than...because we're a large city, you know, and I haven't...you know, haven't followed that closely. And sometimes we bump up right against, you know, Omaha. So whether it's in part of Bellevue or part of Omaha, I don't know.

SENATOR JONES: Yes. I'd...anyway, I'm kind of curious, and I might find out just what happened up there. But it was really a good deal up there, and the work ethics was real good. And so I was glad to see them there. And when they left, it kind of left a void, you know, because a lot of people, they depend on the job. But anyway, I'm going to be supportive of this first amendment to take out LB 620 and LB 270. But I do want something back in for rural Nebraska and see what we can do there. Again, thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jones. The Clerk will have some items. (Visitors introduced.) Mr. Clerk, items for the record.
