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with all of our incentive programs if we wanted to drop taxes down about 50 percent. And if we had low taxes, you don't need incentives. But until we do, we do need incentives. That's just the nature of the business. That's where we are here in Nebraska. I think we've done a good job here with our economic development.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: And I do get concerned any time we start to tamper dramatically with that. I certainly do endorse Senator Brashear's plan, in that we're not then severing contracts that we've entered into. I think this is certainly to be added to this bill. I want to thank the Revenue Committee for bringing this forward. I think it's a discussion that should take place. And I'll certainly then watch the rest of the discussion as we proceed here. But for this amendment, I certainly do endorse it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I would yield my time to Senator Maxwell.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Maxwell.
