Oh, yes, we do. I said, well, 30 years ago you never had this problem. You could buy a new three-bedroom home or build one for 25 to 30 thousand dollars. You could buy a new automobile for \$3,000. Now have you kept up with that in perspective? Well, that ended the conversation. But cattle have been here a long time, Union Pacific has been here a long time, and we've had people here for a long time. And I, talking about packinghouses, I have to support packinghouses. I think they're a great thing. My district has one of the major hog processing plants in the country and they're planning a large expansion to that...to that facility. So...and I am sure they are...they will be recipients of LB 775 dollars. And we should...we will never do away with LB 775. I know that and you know that, and we shouldn't because it does bring dollars into this state. It provides employment to a lot of people. So we can see the numbers, if we can see some of those numbers, not full disclosure, but just something that will satisfy the taxpayers in this state. They want to know. Whether they understand what they see is another thing, but they do want a little bit of disclosure. Mr. Speaker, I don't have anything else to say, and if Senato.
