there, being as he only served less than two years of his first term on the Game and Parks Commission. And that was something that was worked out with the Governor. It...you may say, well, it was a glitch in the way we crafted the legislation last year. But that's...he kind of fell through the cracks there, and so the Governor reappointed him to the new district. Lancaster County is the new district. The old district was the counties surrounding Lancaster County. And so he actually represented the old district. So now he represents the new district. I hope that's clear as mud. But hope you get the gist of the...

SENATOR ERDMAN: And so there...is there an Attorney General's Opinion or somewhere that says that this is allowable under our laws?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, there is not. But...

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...as I recall, if you've not completed a complete term, you'll be eligible to be reappointed. I can double check on that if you want me to.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. So there is a provision that would allow that under our current law?

SENATOR SCHROCK: I believe so.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Any further discussion on the confirmation report offered by the Natural Resources Committee? Seeing none, Senator Schrock, Chairman of the committee, you're recognized to close if you care to. He waives that opportunity.
