you can't do this, and if you do you're under criminal penalty. A very serious sanction. But then we don't tell them how it is they do with what they get anything meaningful that is available to any and all legislators for the purpose of coming to the floor and having debate upon the public record, made a part of the public record, but we're not going to disclose anything. This concept, while it may have a worthy objective, is not specifically and technically well done. And I urge you to adopt the amendment, AM0879, and then maybe we can start trying to refine this process, rather than saying that the executive branch Department of Revenue will provide any and all information from any and all...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...LB 775 applicants not prohibited by federal law to the Legislative Fiscal Office, without telling us why. I don't think that climate is going to be very appealing to a board of directors of a significant company that has a fiduciary duty to its shareholders and to its creditors and to its employees. I don't think they're going to have warm fuzzies about how careful we're being with their proprietary information. And I think that boils it down to the essential aspects. So this amendment, I'll be the first to say, may not be the perfect answer. But it's a counterbalance to the committee's proposed conclusion, and I think it will allow us to work toward a more satisfactory and tailored result. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. (Visitor introduced.) On with discussion of the Brashear amendment to FA1205, Senator Hartnett, followed by Senators Mines, Janssen, Landis, Thompson, Senator Dwite Pedersen, Raikes, Brown, and Brashear. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President and members of the body, I just...I have a hard time understanding Senator Brashear, where he's coming from. Because all we're doing is asking for the same information the Department of Revenue has. We can deputize somebody from the...and this has been done before. We can deputize somebody from our Fiscal Office to get the information. You know, why is the sky falling, as Senator Brashear,...you can
