And I urge the adoption for the reasons I'll try to summarize. Yes, we take out the transfer of any and all information except that which is prohibited by the federal government. We take out the transfer of that information concerning LB 775 applicants from the Department of Revenue to the Legislative Fiscal Office. I don't think the case has been made for needing any and all information not prohibited by federal law to flow over to the Legislative Fiscal Office. The Legislative Fiscal Office is in fact now using the TRAIN model to provide us information by categories. I hear some arguments that I think might be credited as to why we should change the categories, or refine the categories. I don't hear the argument being made that any and all information is necessary to change the categories or to continue to use the model. And maybe I'm just not bright enough to understand.
