SENATOR BROWN: Okay. Well, I'm struggling and so I want to know if this is something that if...what I don't want us to be doing is creating something that would be different for this category than it might be for other categories of agencies and, yet, I understand the importance of being able to look at our agencies and fairly evaluate how they're doing their business. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Speaker Bromm, members, I guess I'm not going to say a whole lot on this issue. I may speak once and that will be it. If everybody speaks once, that's about 50 people to speak, and so we'll give everybody an opportunity here. Everybody wants their time in the light, I guess, and why not? This is one of the major issues. This is one of the major issues that I've been here 13 years. I can't think of another one that's taken as much of our, you might say, time, our dollars, our incentives, or our way of life, or our future in Nebraska. It needs to be reviewed and I think the Revenue Committee, Senator Landis, or whomever is responsible for bringing this, it needs to be reviewed. That's what we're doing, so everybody should get up and make their conscience be known, if you can do that. But it needs to be reviewed and that's what we're doing here. Who knows whether it will be right or not? It will be Senator Tyson's new grandson there that's going to be the judge. It won't be us. We don't know. We do not know what it's done or what it hasn't done. I've heard senators on this floor, I won't mention names, just anti this, just absolutely would have just eradicated it in a second if they could have by one little button. But who knows? The future will tell. But it's good to fine tune it, you might say, so it's good to have this discussion, just great. We got to spend two days, three days, whatever, you know, but we need to do it because we all know that companies don't have to come to Nebraska. In the old days, I remember my dad saying let...will we let them come; will we let them come? Forget the word "let." You got to try and buy them. You've got to entice them. You got to do this. A couple weeks ago, I won't go into it, but there was a organization that was going to come to Kearney. Well, you make up your package, you do your thing and you think
