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We're one of the leading producers of that, but we're one of the last or we're in the last portion in terms of adding value to that. Why do we need to add value? That's where jobs come from. That's where tax dollars are generated from. That's where people can provide a living for their families. I think that if we vote yes on FA1206, we're eliminating a significant portion of industry that is going to very much help our ag industry. Senator Landis made some good arguments about the meat packing facilities that some of the things they do are not exactly right. I mean, all of us would rather have Gateways or Berkshire Hathaway Companies or things of that nature, but unfortunately there's a limited number of those. I think we need to create jobs wherever we can. While these might not be the most exciting, highest paying, sexy jobs there are, it creates jobs. It adds economy. It adds money to our local communities. And I'm going to vote no on FA1206. Again, Senator Landis mentioned some of the bad things that come from the facilities. He mentioned some of the working conditions. Well, we have OSHA to remedy that situation, in my opinion. He mentioned some of the emissions. Well, we have a Department of Environmental Quality that resolves that. I don't think that we need to use LB 775 credits to clean up anyone's act or to make them be a good actor. And again, he's singling out certain components of the industry. Not all the meat packing facilities are bad. Some are. Some are; some aren't, but I don't think that we need to take them out of the mix and further devastate the rural part of our state. Again, if you vote no on LB 1206, you'll maintain the status quo that meat packing facilities shall be eligible to share in these credits and provide jobs for rural communities. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Brown, on the third component of the divided question.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this is a provision that I am absolutely torn on. I have shared with Senator Landis in the past that from a PR standpoint LB 775 and the tax credits would be much better off in public opinion if this provision...if this amendment were adopted. And I listened closely to the litany that he provided of abuses and what...I guess what I struggle with is if there's a way that we can
