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to some questions regarding his amendment?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, would you yield to a question from Senator Smith?

SENATOR LANDIS: Well, not for Senator Bromm's amendment, no. I mean, wouldn't you want to ask Senator Bromm?

SENATOR SMITH: Well, how it relates to the committee amendment. I'm sorry.

SENATOR LANDIS: Ah, gotcha.

SENATOR SMITH: Senator Landis, it's my understanding that the proposed committee amendment, FA1206, that division anyway, it has nothing to do with size. Is that accurate?

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right.

SENATOR SMITH: And conceivably, an operation like Omaha Steaks might not qualify. Would that...?

SENATOR LANDIS: I think not. I don't think that's so. What our intention has always been, all along the line, and why we tried to use this was, we were talking about the kill floor operation. For example, boxing meats is not what we're talking about here. What we're talking about is the kill floor operation.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. But if a company that marketed via direct mail their product, that also had a, quote unquote, slaughterhouse or a packing facility within the confines of the business, does that exclude the whole business, or would it just exclude part of the business? How would that work?

SENATOR LANDIS: The language is meant to exclude the slaughterhouse operation. Now, there is a talk about its integration. And I acknowledge that there's a definitional question there. But the intent of our language and what we were...wanted to say was it was the slaughterhouse operation. Now, if you have an administrative section for the
