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SENATOR BROWN: And it would be up to us, through our Department of Revenue, to make that...to make the determination about sufficiency to proceed with the recapture?

SPEAKER BROMM: Correct. And I think...I tried to do a little thinking about whether the recourse, if the recipient felt...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER BROMM: ...that it was an unfair conclusion on the part of the Department of Revenue, what would be their recourse. I think it's the courts. I don't think it's through the Administrative Procedures Act. I think it's through the courts.

SENATOR BROWN: Okay Well, I find that very helpful. Because I think that...I think that everyone is struggling with whether the resolution to this for the bad actors is the elimination of the whole opportunity for some actors who may not be bad actors. And so...but I think we all want to make sure that if we're providing incentives, we're providing incentives for the kind of business development that benefits the citizens of the state of Nebraska. And with that, I will be supporting AM0927. I see this as the way...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: ...way to do it without throwing out the baby with the bathwater. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Pederson, Don, that is. Excuse me.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I would like to yield my time to Senator Brashear. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, you have almost five minutes.
