SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...or whether we don't adopt it and then polish it for Select File. Thank you very much, Senator Bromm. And with...I'm going to waive the remaining time, because I had the one-minute warning. Correct, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear and Senator Don Pederson. Senator Dwite Pedersen, your light is next, followed by Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. I give my time to Senator Brashear.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Brashear, you have another five minutes.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: (Laugh) Mr. President, you didn't have to say it that way. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Sorry about that.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you. Members of the body, Senator Dwite Pedersen, thank you. I would like to share at this time the concept that...those of you who have been here for a while know that I have tried to consistently talk about growth and how important it is to the state of Nebraska. And I had the opportunity to put together some statistics that I want to share, because it ties right in, as far as I'm concerned, to this argument as to whether or not we should have meatpacking in the state of Nebraska, and whether we should "incentivize" it. Let's go back in history. I'll add these up for you. Eighteen counties in the state of Nebraska have not grown since 1930. Eighteen counties in the state of Nebraska have not grown since 1920. We're at 36. Twelve counties in the state of Nebraska have not grown since 1910. We're at 48. Ten count...pardon me, 11 counties in the state of Nebraska have not grown since 1900. We're at 59 counties. Ten counties in the state of Nebraska have not grown since 1890. We're at 69 counties. That's 69 out
