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gone? Mostly to the two big cities, Omaha and Lincoln. But beyond that point, they have gone to first-class cities. And this gives the median income. It's a little different than that. Gives the median income on what a male earns and what a female earns in these first-class...the 31 first-class cities. It's above what we have in this bill. It's what we have in this bill. I have introduced wage things for a number of years into the Revenue Committee. I modeled mine after LB 936, which was Senator Matzke's bill from a few years ago, which was to help rural economic development. It had a higher wages. That's what came out of committee. The Chamber of Commerce supported that at that time. It was the Governor's bill that Senator Matzke carried for. But they opposed it simply because the wages were too high today. So I simply rise to oppose this, because I think, like Senator Landis said, we're going back. In the Legislature, when we passed LB 775, there's only three of us left that supported it, and we didn't...we have put a wage component of every other bill that we passed as far as incentives for business. The other ones, their...or, second-class cities, and their range of salaries of saying it's higher than Senator Pederson. We're asking the state to give tax breaks, but we want to allow the business to pay lower wages. That is wrong. That is a poor policy. And the reason Walmart...I think, Senator Pederson, maybe you misspoke, is that they have to higher...have higher salaries if they want to qualify for LB 260. I call it the UP bill. So if they want to do that, if they want to get LB 260, has a wage component, which we passed a couple years ago. So Walmart, I think, in North Platte, has to have a higher wage, because of LB 260. So I simply rise to oppose the amendment and support the committee amendment, and I'll give the rest of my time to Senator Beutler if he so desires.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, about two and a half minutes have elapsed.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. Senator Hartnett, thank you for the time. Let me just make one point in the time that's left. In order to qualify under the main program, there is the requirement that there be 30 jobs provided. But the project, as the project may develop, may have
