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34 or 36 or 38 employees. You're going to have the number of employees it takes you to do the work that has to be done. Now, let me ask you this question. If you have a project that has 36 employees, under the law that we're passing, do all 36 of them have to make at least this minimum wage? The answer is no. The 30 that it takes to qualify have to have at least the minimum wage. And above and beyond that, the company can choose as to whether those additional employees will be paid the minimum wage or not. If they're paid the minimum wage in the bill, then they will receive benefits for that person. But they can choose to pay them whatever the federal minimum wage is, those extra people. So I think it's important to...when we're talking about this, that we understand that both with regard to Senator Pederson's amendment...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and with regard to the committee amendment, this doesn't necessarily mean everybody that comes on board to do this new project in Sarpy County or Platte County or wherever is going to be paid the minimum wage. There will still be some who will not, quite possibly. So it has...what we're doing has a limited effect anyway. And that's another reason, in my opinion, not to be watering down that which we are doing. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of the Don Pederson amendment, Senator Kruse.

SENATOR KRUSE: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I also stand to oppose the amendment before us to reduce the level of pay that would be a minimum. But before I speak to that, I want to send a word to quite a few of my friends. It's always an opportunity to give somebody heartburn, and I'll give heartburn to a lot of my friends. I stand in support of LB 775. Always have, do now, and see no reason to change my ways. It has been important to us. It is too bad that we have resistance to disclosure, to appropriate disclosure. That should be an embarrassment to the business community, certainly creates public relations problems for them and for us. I would hope we
