I haven't ever not supported tax incentives. I have...understand the competition between the states, and I accept that. But I can't believe the big businesses who are out there lobbying this bill, and the Governor, who proposed it, as I understand, in the first instance, for them, have to put an embarrassing, embarrassing floor in this bill. This is your constituents' money, it's their taxpayer money that supports bringing these businesses here. And we want them here. But we don't want them paying such a low wage that people can't survive in our communities. They aren't even at subsistence wages. And I'm probably looking at this, more unusually for me, maybe, for a total money reason. Having been on Health and Human Services and the Appropriations Committee, I know how much all these programs cost, and they cost us a lot. And we don't...shouldn't be in a position where every year we keep expanding that budget...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...because people are so poor that they can't afford health care in this state. And we should be incentive..."incenting" companies in our standards to have health benefits for their employees. If you don't vote for this amendment, you'll get to that in the amendment from the Revenue Committee. I went on a health board a couple of years ago, several years ago, serving south Omaha. And I've learned a lot from that health board. One of the surprises that came to me is, one of the big needs...and this board has now gotten to the point where we can cover it...was for podiatrists. Now, being a west Omaha, southwest Sarpy type person, I had no idea why podiatrists were so important to serve the south Omaha community. It's because of the meat packing workers and standing in water all day. These are hard jobs. And as Senator Engel said, these jobs used to pay,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR THOMPSON: ...years ago, a living wage. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Thompson. (Visitors introduced.) Thanks for visiting with us. We appreciate it.
