SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Landis?

SENATOR LANDIS: Um-hmm.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis, I was talking to Senator Tyson but I did hear you say the way the amendment is now the county would have 20,000 inhabitants, they would have to produce 20 jobs, is that correct?

SENATOR LANDIS: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the amount that they would have to invest is what I missed.

SENATOR LANDIS: \$3 million.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: \$3 million, thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Bromm a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm, would you yield to a question?

SPEAKER BROMM: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Bromm, the amendment that you said you were considering would do what, if you offer it?

SPEAKER BROMM: It would reduce the level of investment threshold to \$1 million and the jobs to 10, 10 jobs.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: An investment of \$1 million, 10 jobs, so my \$343,200 would be cut in half. To make it easy for me, \$170,000 a year payroll. What kind of business can get started for \$1 million? But before you answer that, let me ask you a question. If I wanted to go into farming right now and I had \$1 million, what chance would I have of being successful as a farmer if that's the totality of the amount I can invest?

SPEAKER BROMM: You got \$1 million in cash?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all cash. All I can beg, borrow and
