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steal, that's why I say that's the total amount that I can come up with. I can't get a penny more than that.

SPEAKER BROMM: Yeah, it...I wouldn't say that it wouldn't be possible, but it'd be difficult to get a decent sized farming operation started for that, difficult.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I would like...so we're not talking about somebody going into farming, but would a person be prohibited from going into farming, investing \$1 million and hiring 10 farmhands? Are we, in other words, restricting the type of business that the investment can be made in?

SPEAKER BROMM: I don't think that would qualify but I would probably yield the answer to that to Senator Landis for sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I would ask Senator Landis that question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Chambers, I want to give you off the top of my head the answer is, no, you wouldn't be able to qualify. Let me tell you one place that I do know that you can't qualify, and you can't qualify for a retail outlet. Can't do it, for example, like Dillard's, okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's okay You're beating me to my next point because I wanted to call on Senator Janssen.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, do you yield?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Janssen, because we had...I've had this argument before because they wouldn't allow in rural areas the money to be invested in a retail establishment, and I felt those were the kind that you might be most likely be able to get some people to invest in...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.
