SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...get some jobs, and turn some money over pretty quickly. So here's the question I would ask you. SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, Mr. President, I would like to ask Senator Landis a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, will you respond?

SENATOR LANDIS: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis, I wanted to establish, not just by my saying it, that I had argued in favor of retail outlets. In the rural area, with them saying main street is dying, stores are going out of business and retail establishments, why, since we're making a distinction between
