advantage of and purchase whatever it is you sell going to come from? If they have to travel a great distance and haul something, then there are transportation and fuel costs, and they can get it cheaper someplace else. So it might sound alluring to say \$1 million and 10 jobs, but the reality, from where I sit, is that that's not going to work. This is what hurts the rural community, not what some of us talked about this morning in terms of making whoever gets these jobs, I mean gets this money for starting these jobs having to pay a certain minimum wage. What hurts the rural community is when we put something in place that is just a sop, s-o-p. It looks like we're doing something but, in fact, we're doing nothing. The amount of investment has to be sufficiently large to make it possible to start a business with a chance of succeeding. If you put the amount low, you are building in failure, and I don't think it's going to work. And somebody might say, well, it's not a maximum of \$1 million, that's the minimum. Somebody might see where they can start a business and they'd invest a lot more money. So I'd like to ask Senator Landis a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis, if Wal-Mart wanted to open a warehouse, could they get LB 775 money?

SENATOR LANDIS: They can get it if it is for a distribution center and, in fact, have done so. I think it's in the North Platte area, as I recall. It's not a retail outlet. It's a distribution center by which they feed then their goods out to various retail centers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if that seemed to be the only viable business, it would probably have to be on a large enough scale and tied into a going concern to get them to come there and then they'd get LB 775 money and not even bother with this, would that be correct? Because they couldn't double-dip, could they?

SENATOR LANDIS: The project, you get...you can have multiple projects inside the same company but they are accounted for separately. But let me just see if I can get to the nature of
