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SENATOR STUTHMAN: At the present time, I really...I really can't think of any, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So thank you, Senator Stuthman. What I'm saying is that I think this is one of those sops. We're going to make it look like LB 775 spreads the wealth, and it works for everybody, but you cannot make it work in an area where there is no basis on which success can be built. If you build masonry structures, no wood, just masonry...oh, you might have some steel and glass, but the only place available for building is sandy, weak soil. You cannot build where the land is available because the land will not accommodate what you build. So you have sandy, weak soil in the rural area, and the only kind of businesses that might flourish are those which are too heavy to be supported by the soil on which they will be constructed. So here I am wanting to get this money or these tax breaks to construct my business, and I've got to construct it in a certain area before I can get it, but the area where I can construct it in order to get the breaks is an area where my business cannot function. So we create the appearance that an opportunity is here when, in fact, it is not. What I'm willing to leave my mind open to hear is one example of a bill like this or procedure like this working in any state's rural area.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Because that will show us the kind of business or the kinds of businesses that would benefit from what is being offered here. Otherwise, it's another chimera, something that appears to be there but it's not. It's a will-o-the-wisp. That's that light that you think you see in the swamp, and you follow it. And every time you get where you thought it was, it's not there anymore. It's phosphorous glowing and you think that you see a light. And that's how people get lost in swamps and they are never seen or heard from again until an alligator eats them up and they wind up a part of an alligator bag being carried down the street by a woman but she doesn't know that the person is a part of that bag, although they are being seen. It's just like if a tree falls in the forest and nobody is there to hear it. Does it make a sound? If somebody is a part of an alligator bag and nobody knows it,
