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to the premises or facilities, but it doesn't talk about damage done to a person. So when you are training a dog, you're trying to teach that dog certain things and make an evaluation and assessment of the suitability of that dog. If this dog is put in these environments, restaurants, amusement parks, every place open to the public, you need to be sure that that dog is not going to behave in a way that is untoward. So when you talk about liability and there is none for this untrained dog, I think you are giving an immunity which is inappropriate. The existing law that grants that immunity is talking about a dog fully trained. Now if the dog is supposedly trained and the trainer turns it over to a person, and the dog does something it's not supposed to, the trainer may then have some liability rather than the person who is using the dog. I don't know what the agreement or contractual relationship would be between those two. But whenever we put an immunity clause or limited liability clause in the statutes, we need to make sure that that clause is broad enough to embrace the type of harm that may be done. So whereas some of these bills may not be deemed controversial, I do not think they are in an appropriate form to be enacted into law. So I would have questions and discussions of all of these that you all want to put...or they would take the place of LB 667. AM0821 would become the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So I'm just going to see what the body decides to do, and then I will chart my course from that point. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members. First of all, I would like to address the point that Senator Chambers just made when he was referring to these young dogs having not been trained, and referred to them as some of them might be snappers. I think it's necessary to point out that before these dogs ever get to the point that they go on the street, they go through a very strenuous evaluation. And any dog that is hyper in the least bit...you know, it has to be the most mellowest mellow of dogs before it's even selected to take part in this
