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substitution, since we're giving an abbreviation for all the others. I'd like to ask Senator Jensen a question.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Jensen, did you follow what I was saying?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, I did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: And I understand exactly what you're saying there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and it wouldn't be too difficult for us to just fix that up, would it?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, not at all.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now I want to go to a substantive question for you on page 15. In line 7, it says: A pharmacist shall not drug product select a drug product unless, then I drop down to subpart (c), the manufacturer, distributor, or packager of the drug product provides reasonable services, as determined by the board, to accept the return of drug products that have reached their expiration date. Return of the drug products by whom, the pharmacist or the person who has purchased them?

SENATOR JENSEN: We're talking about the manufacturer here. I would think...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and they must accept the return. But who is, under this language, to return the drugs that have reached their expiration date, the purchaser or the pharmacist or both? Because I'm just not sure, and that's why I'm asking the question.

SENATOR JENSEN: And I would sure be glad to clarify that. To
