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me, I think it's the manufacturer, it's not the purchaser, not the client.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR JENSEN: But I would certainly like to look into that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now when we're talking about...how much time do I have, Mr. Speaker, on this time around?

SPEAKER BROMM: Two minutes and twenty seconds.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I may be able to ask the question. We're still talking about when a pharmacist may not drug select. Let me find what I wanted to ask you in this short period of time. Oh, a patient or representative or caregiver of such patient instructs that there shall be no drug product selection. Who would a representative be? Does that mean a legal representative?

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't know, Senator...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We could find that out though.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay, I sure can.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And a caregiver, that could just be a family member, could it not? Or is that term defined somewhere?

SENATOR JENSEN: It's...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if you don't know the answer...

SENATOR JENSEN: ...it's not defined in this bill.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, those are the things I'd like to know, and here's why. Because we're substituting drugs, and I want to find out who is in a position to say, yea or nay.

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING
