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SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, so that's why I'm asking those questions, and I'm not requiring you to give me an answer right now. I'm not going to offer any amendments right now, but this...thank you, Mr. President, and I'll turn on my light.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You heard the opening on FA1209 to AM0821 to LB 667. The next speakers are Senator Bourne and Senator Chambers. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, and members. Senator Jensen, I'm glad that you understood what Senator Chambers said because I certainly didn't. I would like to ask Senator Jensen a question or two, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Jensen, I missed part of your opening. Could you tell me which bills you are putting into AM0821?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes. Senator Bourne, by the way, you have a sheet that we passed out, that might be the easiest way.

SENATOR BOURNE: Oh, I see it. I didn't see it until...Senator Synowiecki absconded with my copy, I think. Could you tell me, Senator Jensen, did all of these bills come from the Health and Human Services Committee or were some of these bills in other committees?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, they are all within the Health and Human Services Committee.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. The particular area, just in a brief reading of this, I'm concerned about those provisions that you have that deal with drugs, prescription drugs, generic drugs and that, and as you know...well, maybe you don't know, but a significant portion of my district are senior citizens, and I'm
