SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: What if, say, Senator Chambers wanted to start a mail order pharmacy, would he be, in Omaha, would he be...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: ... would he have to meet these criteria or does this only apply to nonresident mail order pharmacists?

SENATOR JENSEN: It applies to anyone in the state or without.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. And, again, there was no requirement as is indicated in the new language on 7 that that mail order pharmacy employ a full-time pharmacist? There are no national regulations or rules regarding this?

SENATOR JENSEN: I don't know what the national regulations are. It does allow us to look into that, and like I said, if somebody is a bad actor. There was some, I believe, some testimony that there was a couple, I think one down in Texas, that were not using proper procedures. That was the reason.

SENATOR BOURNE: Has there, Senator Jensen, has there been a history here in Nebraska of bad actors? I mean do we have documented cases where individuals...

SENATOR JENSEN: Not that I'm aware of in Nebraska, no.

SENATOR BOURNE: So we're just trying to close a loophole that...

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay, and again but I guess what I'm asking, again, is if we're requiring a mail order pharmacist to add a full-time...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time. Thank you, Senator Bourne. We're discussing the floor amendment, FA1209, offered by Senator Chambers to AM0821 offered by Senator Jensen to LB 667. Senator
