SENATOR JENSEN: No. We did that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, That was done at another time but not in this bill whatsoever.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Do you know what the equivalency between technicians and pharmacists are now, whether they are required? How many technicians per pharmacist?

SENATOR JENSEN: No, I can find that out in a minute though.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I believe that Nebraska's, in the state of Nebraska, is a smaller number than there are in other states. And visiting several years ago in California with a pharmacist in a large supermarket, I asked her, you know, how many technicians they used in that particular state? And she said it was two to one. And I asked her if that was a...if that, in her opinion, was the right number?. And she said, no, actually the right number would be one to one. But that particular state at that time had moved to two to one. And I know there other states that have as high as five to one. I hope we aren't allowing that to grow. So if off the floor you could find that out for me, I would be interested in (inaudible).

SENATOR JENSEN: Senator, I was informed it is two to one here in Nebraska also.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Two to one in Nebraska.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, and that...is that you're advocating here or don't you have any control over mail order pharmacies that ship pharmaceuticals into this state? Do we have any control over that?

SENATOR JENSEN: Over out-of-state pharmacists?
