SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: Okay, let me ask you this question. If you read the various magazines in that there is quite a number of people, and not necessarily in Nebraska, but I would imagine there are some in that mix, that are actually going to either Canada or Mexico to obtain drugs. And I understand that at the Mall of America there is some sort of an outlet that Canadian drugs are being sold at, I guess. Does this impact that at all? And, again, it's in the interest of we want our citizens to be protected but not gouged, so to speak.

SENATOR JENSEN: It doesn't address that issue at all. It doesn't mention it. Yeah, I know what you're talking about there. They tell me that it's illegal for a pharmacist in Canada to ship drugs down into the United States.

SENATOR BOURNE: It is. It is but I guess the federal government has not taken any action.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR BOURNE: And I'm speculating that it's simply because of the huge or significant cost to our citizens. I'm going to continue to listen to the debate but...and, again, Senator Jensen, I wasn't...I know that you've always worked towards equity and fairness and that, and I doubt very much that there is anything in here that you're aware of that would increase the cost of these drugs, but I just wanted to verify that.
