of the bill now, as it has been amended, does not mean that I don't have questions or problems. And I say that for Senator Jensen's sake. I don't want him to feel that I'll be pulling the rug out from under him if on Select File I raise questions that I'm not raising now. Having read the amendment prior to coming here today but not studying it in depth because of other bills that were before us, and especially the one that told me that my rural colleagues are rubes, that they ain't worth nothin', and that they can be suckered and tricked by making them think that somehow LB 775 is going to apply to them and make economic development possible. I was giving time to that bill. Other parts of Senator Jensen's bill I have not been able to thoroughly go through, but I have one question I would like to put to Senator Jensen, then I won't speak any more today on this bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Jensen, would you respond?
