SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Orville Coady, still sitting on the bench, still misapplying the law and still doing everything that brings a shame on the judiciary and brings the administration of justice into contempt. And since those whose job it is to administer the court system are spitting in my face and the face of black women and others in whose behalf I've spoken, I'm going to show that spitting can go both ways. And I will continue when I'm recognized again. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, followed by Senator Beutler and Senator Chambers. Senator Schimek, on AM0770.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I'd like to begin by saying and reiterating the thank-yous to the people I think have been instrumental in this bill, no matter how modestly they try to disclaim that, and that would be Senators Brashear, Pedersen, and Chambers. I think this is a very good effort. And I like the idea of community corrections and I like the idea of not putting violent...or nonviolent offenders behind bars if we don't need to. I like the idea of drug rehabilitation and all the kinds of things that I think will go into this program. My worry is that there won't be money to fund the programs appropriately. We are not funding the drug rehabilitation programs appropriately now in our prison system. Will it be done any better in the community corrections system? I also recall the days when we decided to shut down a lot of the mental health institutions in the state and put people back into the communities, and I remember how we didn't fund the community programs adequately or appropriately. So I want to make sure that I understand fiscally how this program is going to work, and I would like to ask Senator Brashear, if he would, to go into a little bit of explanation of the fiscal note, which I see indicates that total expenditures, if I'm reading this right, are \$125,170 and...in the first year, and \$71,879. I can't believe that's the total fiscal note. I must be misreading this. And then the revenue on this...in the same fiscal note indicates over \$2.5 million the first year, and a little over \$5 million the second year. Senator Brashear, could you help me through this fiscal note a little bit? There are a lot of pages here and I want to make certain that I'm
