maintaining discrimination, segregation against black people, segregated schools, discriminatory employment, discrimination in housing, so I thank the terrorists for that. I want to thank my brother Saddam Hussein. Why do I call him my brother? Because America is willing to kill up all the people in Iraq to get rid of Saddam Hussein, which parallels the fact that Nebraska voters were willing to kill off all of my white colleagues in the Legislature to kick me out of the Legislature. So I want to go down that list of thanking all of those people and I will not thank by name everybody who worked on this bill, because that has been done. One person and one element of the system I will not thank is the Chief Justice of the Nebraska Supreme Court and those whose job it is to discipline wrongdoing judges. I don't use the "N" word but I want you all to know Coady used the word "nigger" while sitting on the bench. He's still there. He referred to a black woman in court as chocolate people. He's still there. He has done other wrongful things to white litigants and I've filed complaints in their behalf too, so it's not just when black people are inappropriately dealt with. He's still drawing a salary. He still is cloaked with all the authority of a judge. He can do these wrongful things on the bench, the Chief Justice and the others know he has done it, and they sit there and do nothing. He made such wrongful comments with reference to a Latino man...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that the Attorney General's Office even called attention to it and raised questions about the ethical propriety of it, and Coady still sits there. So, while everybody is in such a good mood and praising everybody else, I want you all to know that there is a subculture in this society which is still suffering injustice at the hands of the judicial system. So after they get through liberating those people in Iraq, I want them to come right back here and liberate black people. While they're talking about forcing democracy on the Middle East, I want them to give black people a little more democracy right here in America. I have one more time that I can speak before I offer amendments or whatnot, so thank you at this point, Mr. President.
