keep these people from out behind the walls. They're not in prison. They're out working. They're being rehabilitated some work ethic and discipline and a family setting, actually. And there are a lot of people out there that say they don't want to leave, when their time is up out at McCook. They'd rather stay there. So I applaud Senator Brashear and the committee for working this way toward community corrections. And I think we have a program out there that anybody would like to come out and look at. It's working well. It may even need to be expanded. With that, thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. There are no further lights on. Senator Brashear, you're recognized to... is Senator Brashear available? Yes. Senator Brashear, do you wish to close on your amendment to the Judiciary Committee amendments?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I do, Mr. President. Thank you. members of the body, thank you for your patience, as this is a big bill. This is an important subject matter. This particular amendment, AM1002, is before you. This is a result of discussions, as I indicated, that I've had with a number of members, and most specifically, Senator Chambers. This amendment to the committee amendment relates to probation fees and parole fees and the "waiverability" of those fees in the event of undue hardship or "indency"...what is my problem today, indigency. Thank you. The amendment specifies that the fee shall be waived when an undue hardship exists. And the emphasis is on the word "shall". And that in addition, a clarification is made by providing that a parolee who is unable to pay parole fees because he or she is financially unable to do so shall not be incarcerated because of nonpayment, nor shall their parole be revoked. One of the overarching goals of this is to find less expensive, more effective ways to deal with the issues in the lives of the people over whom we're exercising jurisdiction. I would...you've heard a number of people say that this amendment is positive and contributes to the effort. And I would urge your adoption of AM1002 to the committee amendment. Thank you.
