SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Quandahl. One last question, and it's in the...in line 3 of Section 1 of that amendment. It says, "in the course of a demutualization or a related reorganization of a life insurance corporation." Can you tell me what a related reorganization is? And, again, I'm...you know, I understand the demutualization portion, but what is a related reorganization? Is that when a...the two companies would merge or what is that exactly?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yeah, it could be. It could be a merger. It could be, you know, a conversion from a mutual company to a stock company. I'd have to pull out my dictionary to get you an actual legal description of what that means, but I think you're heading down the right path.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Senator Quandahl. Mr. Chair, if I could yield the rest of the time back to Senator Brown.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There's about a minute and 15 left, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you, Mr. President. I wondered if Senator Quandahl would yield to a couple questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Would you yield, Senator Quandahl? There's a minute left, Senator Brown.

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, I would.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you. This is related to the bill because the bill opens up the unclaimed property section, but does this have anything to do directly with the bill?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: When you say anything directly to do with the bill, I mean it does open up that particular section of statutes dealing with the Treasurer's Office with unclaimed property, but I guess I would have to say that, as far as centralized receipting, the demutualization of insurance companies, no, it doesn't, it doesn't deal directly with that topic.
