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SENATOR BROWN: Okay. Is this...and you mentioned other states doing this, but is this "precedented" within the state of Nebraska?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: It's my understanding that this was done one other time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry, but time is up. Senator Jensen, on the Quandahl amendment.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. And perhaps I can give some of my time to Senator Brown and Senator Quandahl if they wish to carry on their conversation. But I do want to follow up and would like to ask Senator Quandahl if he would respond to a question, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Quandahl, would you yield?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Yes, I would.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes, thank you, and I just want to follow up on what Senator Brown...Bromm...Bourne, excuse me, Bourne and Brown, Bourne started with in that in your opening statements you said there could be as much as \$10 million that perhaps could be generated for the state, wherever it might be used. Is that correct?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: Ten million.

SENATOR JENSEN: However, that \$10 million, we're talking about reducing a period from five years to two years. At the present time, this type of thing, after five years, would also be part of the same dollars that the State Treasurer puts out in the paper in a disclosure form. Is that correct?

SENATOR QUANDAHL: That's correct.

SENATOR JENSEN: So what we're really doing here is trying to reduce from five years to two years a process. Is that correct?
