Senator Quandahl, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK:      About a minute and a half left, Senator Quandahl.

SENATOR QUANDAHL:      Yeah, thank you. And I'm just...as we all know, the stock market is down a little bit right now and so to kind of follow up on what Senator Jensen was talking about, I think probably one of the reasons why there haven't been as many demutualizations currently as there have been in the past is because if there was an initial public offering of stock right now, with the depressed prices right now, it wouldn't generate as much money for the companies, for the policyholders, and so it may not be in their best interests. And I would imagine...

SENATOR CUDABACK:      One minute.

SENATOR QUANDAHL:      ...that's probably the reason for the lower number of demutualizations that have been going on over the past couple of years. It's just because of the nature of the stock market. But, anyway, I wanted to talk a little bit. In my handout that I handed out there, you'll see there's a figure. It's somewhat more than \$9 million that has been identified as a result of five different company demutualizations that are potential. Now, again, these figures are not for sure. You never know what's for sure until it actually gets turned over to the State Treasurer. But in past years, let me just give you some ideas of the total amount of unclaimed property that's been turned over to the State Treasurer. In last year, in 2002, \$4,362,000. That was the total amount. In 2001, it was \$5,812,000. In the year 2000, it was just \$2,611,000; 1999, \$1,727,000.
